Dairy Health Rules

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, official metal ear tag, registration number (can only be used if the tattoo is recorded on the registration certificate or for breeds where pictures are acceptable), or individual brands, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate.

Illinois Cattle

Brucellosis

1. Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Tuberculosis

2. Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tuberculin testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Please note: Illinois calves less than 6 months of age, and Illinois steers are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

LIVINGSTON COUNTY GENERAL DAIRY RULES

1. Please read, follow, and understand all "General Rules and Regulations," "Exhibition Livestock Health Requirements," and "National Code of Show Ring Ethics" as listed in the front of this fair book.
2. **All female dairy projects must be accompanied by a health certificate. All health papers will be picked up at the gate upon entering the grounds. No animals will be permitted on the grounds without the necessary health papers.**
3. **All purebred animals shown will be registered in the name of the person making the entry by June 1 of current year.** Registration papers will be checked by Superintendents before the animal is exhibited.
4. Non-registered heifers will be permitted to show provided they have Identified Grade Papers from their breed association. All nonregistered animals must have Identified Grade Papers prior to the fair. The papers must be in the name of the exhibitor.
5. Each exhibitor will be limited to one entry under each premium number.
6. An entry fee of \$3.00 will be charged for each premium number, except showmanship.
7. Judging of Costume Class will take place following the dairy show on Wednesday in the Show Barn. Participants must enter premium number on fair entry form. Handler and animal should be in costume. Participant must be entered in dairy show and paid the entry fee.
8. All cattle will be assigned to stalls by the superintendent.
9. Dam and Daughter: Both females must be entered and shown in respective classes.
10. Produce of Dam: Group to consist of 2 animals, any age, female, the produce of one cow. The dam must be named.
11. **Entries in the Dairy classes must have been owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor in accordance with the following project starting dates:**
 - Junior and Senior Calves - May 1 of current year
 - Junior Heifers - June 1 of current year
 - Senior Heifers - January 1 of current year
 - Cows - October 1 of previous year
12. Best 3 females must be owned & exhibited by same person.
13. Cell phones in show ring are strictly forbidden. Disregard of this rule will be severely addressed by the dairy superintendents and/or the fairboard.

The calving date will determine the premium number for each entry. The dates shall be as follows:

 Winter Heifer Calf - Born after December 1 of previous year to Feb 28 of current year

 Spring Yearling Heifer - Born March 1 through May 31 of previous year
 Winter Yearling Heifer - Born December 1 two years previous through February of previous year
 Fall Yearling Heifer - Born September 1 two years previous through November 30 of previous year
 Cow, 2 years old - Born September 1 through August 30 two years previous
 Cow Aged - Born before August 31 three years **previous**

LOT 29 – PRODUCTION AWARD

A premium of \$9.00 each will be paid as a recognition on cows that have equaled or exceeded the butterfat listed below in not over 305 days 2 X M E on Official DHI or DHR test. Two-year-old cows and heifers may qualify for the premium on the basis of the record of their dam.

Each exhibitor may enter and collect premium money on one animal in this lot.

To qualify, records must be presented to the Dairy Superintendent no later than 8:30 A.M. on day of show of the fair. Livingston County Ag Fair Association will not be responsible in any case if exhibitors fail to qualify their animals for production premiums. Dairy Superintendents and Dairy Judge will review and announce placing during dairy show.

Awards will be made only for cows equaling or exceeding these breed averages:

LOT 32 – BUCKET CALF

1. The First year Bucket Calf project is designed for youth 8-12 and 13-18 years of age. The Second year Bucket Calf class will be ages 8-18.
2. First year Bucket Calves must be born from September 1 of prior year to June 1 of current year. First year Bucket calves will NOT be eligible for the Bucket Calf Livestock Sale. First year Bucket Calves must be tattooed and pictured with the owner following the Bucket Calf show to be eligible to return the following year for the Second year Bucket Calf Class. See superintendent after show for tattoos and picture.
3. Second year Bucket Calves are calves that were exhibited at the Livingston County Ag Fair during the previous year by the same exhibitor and qualify by virtue of the First year Bucket Calf guidelines. Second year Bucket Calves are eligible for the Bucket Calf Livestock Sale. Steers must be weighed in. See superintendents for designated weigh in time. 2nd year bucket steers will sell at the conclusion of the beef sale. Steers must weigh a minimum of 1000 lbs to be eligible for sale.
4. 1st year Bucket Calves may be dairy or beef, steers or bulls. 2nd year Bucket calves must be dairy steers only. 2nd year Bucket Calves must be dehorned.
5. Calves shown as bucket calves may not be shown in other Livingston Co. Ag Fair classes.
6. Calves will be divided by Superintendents for the Bucket Calf show.
7. Exhibitors are limited to one entry in the 1st year Bucket Calf class and one entry in the 2nd year Bucket Calf class.
8. Completed Bucket Calf Project Records must be turned in to Dairy Superintendent upon arrival Tuesday night. 1st and 2nd year projects must use the proper record book. 1st and 2nd year record books are NOT the same.
9. The following criteria will be used for judging the Bucket Calf classes:

Bucket Calf Scoring

Evaluation of the completed record book	35 points
*Evaluation of the exhibitors knowledge in interview	35 points
Health and condition of animal	15 points
Evidence of training and showing (showmanship)	15 points
Total Possible Points	100 Points

*Parents may listen to oral interview, but may NOT speak to judge or child during interviewing period.

1. All Bucket Calves must follow Livingston County Ag Fair Rules and Regulations on stall care and Health care of Livestock.
2. 1) Calves to be shown on rope halter and broke to lead.
 2) No show sticks will be allowed.
 3) No clipping allowed. Washing and brushing are the only preparations needed to show your Bucket Calf.
3. All Rules are at the discretion of the Superintendents in charge of the show.
